

#### PROCEDURES AND COMMON RULES

- Abolition of people control at internal borders;
- Common rules applicable to people crossing the external borders of the Member States of the EU;
- Harmonization of entry conditions and rules on visas for short stays;
- Harmonization of procedures for asylum;





#### **COMPENSATORY MEASURES**

- Strengthening of the cooperation amongst police officers (in particular regarding the right of surveillance and cross-border pursuit);
- Strengthening of judicial cooperation through a faster extradition system and a better transfer of enforcement of criminal judgments;
- Creation and development of the Schengen Information System (SIS) now called SIS II.

#### **TENDENCIES 2015**

- Reduction of foreign citizens residing in NT;
- Increase of people controlled at the border;
- Increase of entry denials;
- Increased document fraud detected;
- Increase in asylum applications at borders;




