


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

Why BBI JU is needed

European public-private partnership is needed to :

- De-risk investments by pooling resources from public & private sectors
- Offer a joint financial commitment and jointly defined programme at EU level
- Have **common approach**, across sectors & borders
- Organize the value chains
- Reach critical mass of this "emerging" sector
- Implement clear framework that brings clarity for activities & investments and ensures long term stability and predictability
- Leverage additional investments



Expected impact for Europe by 2030

- Replace 25% of oil-based chemicals
- 10 times more bio-based materials
- Increase biomass supply by 20%
- Increase by 25% mobilisation of unused sources
- Diversify and grow farmers' revenues
- Create 700,000 jobs 80% in rural areas
- Reduce EU's dependency on import of fossil raw materials, protein (- 50%) and P – K (- 25%)
- Develop potential of agro-food "waste" & forestry residues
- Shift to bio-based economy → average 50% GHG emission reduction








Differences: 'consortium own contribution'

- BBI JU is a public-private partnership...
- ...so we need contributions from both the public (EU) and private (project beneficiaries, incl. BIC members) side
- 'Consortium own contribution': 1 or more of the following 3 elements:
 - Financial contributions ('In cash')
 - 'in kind' contributions
 - 'Additional investments'



Types of contributions


- 'In cash' / financial contributions = money (€)
- 'In kind' = other (than monetary), *non- funded* contributions to a project, e.g.:
 - Human resources: people working on project, without (asking for) funding of their costs
 - Other resources: consumables, machines, buildings, equipment,...





Types of contributions

- 'In cash' / financial contributions = money (€)
- 'In kind' = other (than monetary), *non-funded* contributions to a project, e.g.:
 - Human resources: people working on project, without (asking for) funding of their costs
 - Other resources: consumables, machines, buildings, equipment,...
- 'Additional investments':
 - resources **NOT** part of a project (budget)...
 - ...but that help to maximise the impact of the project OR of the BBI JU programme





Differences with H2020 evaluation



- Only for IAs (Innovation Actions)
- Close to market (TRL 6-7 or even 8) → business case and plan needed
- No page limits (can be included in section 4-5 of the proposal)
- More info: see Annex 4b of the <u>Call 2018 Guide for</u> <u>Applicants</u>

Differences: evaluation subcriteria

- Although the 3 main evaluation criteria (Excellence, impact, implementation) are the same...
- ...the previously mentioned differences with Horizon 2020 have been translated into (some) BBI JU-specific evaluation <u>sub</u>criteria





Cover every aspect

« Every word counts » at all levels:

- **Topic text** result of negotiations between industry & EU
- Evaluation (sub)criteria
- Proposal template

Tips:

- Copy/paste the topic text
- Divide it in different (grouped) sentences
- Does your proposal idea tick all the boxes? What / who (expertise) are you missing?


H2020 subcriteria (RIAs and IAs)

Extent that proposed work is <u>beyond the</u> <u>state of the art</u>, and demonstrates innovation potential.

- What is the state of the art? What's the benchmark now?
- ...and how does your proposal go beyond the state of the art ?
- <u>Tip</u>:
 - clearly describe the (starting and end) TRLs
 - e.g. via a <u>table</u> (left: state of the art + start TRL; right: envisaged end TRL)

BBI JU-specific subcriterion (IAs)

Coverage of the <u>whole value chain</u>



(IAs are close to market => this subcriterion checks that your idea take into account biomass, processing and end products & markets) 58



Impact: SO WHAT?



BBI H2020 subcriteria (all actions)

Exploitation, dissemination and communication of project results (including IPR and - where relevant - research data management)

- <u>Dissemination & exploitation</u>: more than an eligibility criterion; this is also evaluated by experts
- <u>Tips</u>:
 - Also provide quantative data (how many conferences, publications, target audiences,...) => be *specific*, avoid 'generic' diss./comm./expl. plans
 - Include relevant (also public) deliverables
 - Explicitly describe IPR management (Intellectual Property Rights) – every word counts


Outputs of the project vs. the <u>expected</u> <u>impacts</u> mentioned in the work plan

- Are all 'expected impacts' listed in the topic text dealt with in your proposal...
- ... in a qualitative **AND** quantitative manner?
- Often link with BBI JU KPIs
 - More info on BBI JU KPIs: see SIRA
 - SIRA is more than a theoretical text

BBI JU subcriteria (*RIAs and IAs*)

Extent to which the proposed <u>consortium</u> <u>own</u> <u>contribution</u>, including additional investments, will help **maximising** the impact of the action

- Clearly describe if and how much "own contribution" ('in kind', 'in cash' <u>and/or</u> 'additional investments') is included in the proposal...
- ...AND explain how this will maximise the impact of the action
- Don't just list the amounts, also explain them
- Where to explain this? See:
 - FAQ for Applicants
 - Guide for Applicants

H2020 subcriteria (all actions)

<u>Allocation of tasks</u>, ensuring that <u>all</u> <u>participants have a valid role</u> and adequate resources

convince expert-evaluators that you don't have 'token' consortium members, e.g. via resource allocation (money talks...)

H2020 subcriteria (all actions)

<u>Management</u> structures and procedures, <u>including risk and innovation</u> management.

- Consortium of 5 or 20 members: different management (structures) needed
- 'Innovative' management techniques are not necessary; it needs to work!
- <u>Tips</u>:
 - explicitly mention / describe risk and innovation management... (every word counts)
 - ...and include 'real' (not token) risks and mitigation measures

BBI JU-specific subcriteria (IAs)

Soundness of the business case and business plan

<u>Why?</u> IAs are close to market => business case and business plan are needed

<u>How?</u> See Guide for Applicants and proposal template (bullet points describing business case & plan requirements)

FAQ: how much info is needed? enough to convice

- "(Further) details can be provided in part B sections 4-5" (= not included in 70-page limit)
- (Only) for Flagships: additional info via hearings



BBI JU-specific subcriteria (IAs)

Readiness of the technology

- <u>Tip</u>: clearly indicate the start and end TRLs
- "In particular, for flagships applicants must demonstrate that by the time of the submission of their application they have been operating relative demonstration scale plants at a significant production capacity (justification shall be provided in the proposal)."

Proposal template

- Main message of Call 2017 BBI JU info day: « Write for an evaluator »
- Help the evaluators find the right info as quickly and efficiently as possible
- Important: *what* you write and *where* you write it



Proposal template

- Use the proposal structure found in the Participant Portal / BBI JU Guide for Applicants
- Stick to 'part B section 1-3' page limits (50 for CSAs, 70 for RIAs and IAs)
- For IAs: put business case/plan info in 'Part B section 4-5' (no page limits)





Financial aspects in evaluation



Rules for participation

Who can apply?

- Any '**legal entity**' (natural or legal person created & registered under national law) e.g. any company, big or small, research organisations, universities, non-governmental organisations, etc. from <u>all over the world</u>
- Also international organisations or participants from non EU/H2020 Associated countries can participate

Who can be funded?

Automatically eligible for funding:

- EU and Horizon 2020 Associated Countries
- Countries listed in Annex A of the Horizon 2020 Work Programmes

NOT automatically eligible for funding:

 Industrialised countries and emerging economies: participants are not eligible BUT some countries have forms of co-funding mechanisms

EXCEPTIONS if: bilateral agreement; country is identified in AWP or call₇₄



Rules for participation

BBI JU calls follow H2020 rules for participation, except:

- No BBI JU funding for large industries in RIA & CSA
- Additional eligibility condition for some RIA topics in Call 2018

- **BBI JU Guide for Applicants** (GfA): details on how to structure and prepare your proposal

Consortium own contribution What and Why?

Leverage of private investments is crucial!

In kind contributions

The costs incurred by one partner implementing the project minus the funding provided by BBI JU

Financial contributions

Financial transfers from one or more to one or more partners of a BBI JU project to carry out part of the action

Additional investments

Investments (e.g. infrastructure, facilities, durable equipment, etc.) that contribute to reaching the objectives of the projects and the BBI initiative



Consortium own contribution where to include it in the proposal?

- In kind contributions: no further explanations needed
- **Financial contributions**
 - **Part A:** Call specific question: quantitative description
 - Part B, section 3.4: table containing information on beneficiaries providing and receiving the financial contribution, the amount, and the activities performed
- Additional investments
 - **Part A:** Call specific question: quantitative description
 - Part B, section 3.4: specific table with breakdown and description of additional activities, and how the help to achieve the objectives of the BBI initiative All info & templates

Financial aspects in BBI JU Calls take-away messages


• BBI follows H2020 rules and financial regime, except:

- No BBI JU funding for large industries in RIA & CSA
- Additional eligibility condition for some RIA topics in Call 2018
- BBI is a PPP and an industry-driven programme: leveraging of private investments is crucial
- Consortium own contribution (in kind, financial contributions and additional activities) is <u>assessed</u> during the evaluation
- Read carefully the AWP 2018, GfA & FAQs to help you prepare a successful proposal.



The process From Submission to Grant Signature







ADMISSIBILITY CRITERIA

A proposal submitted via the official online submission system before the call deadline and it is readable, accessible and printable

Complete proposal accompanied by the relevant administrative forms, proposal description and any supporting documents specified in the call.

The proposal includes a draft plan for the exploitation and dissemination of the results

Page limit (RIA/IA: 70 pages –CSA: 50 pages)



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Contents are in line with the topic description in the call

Consortium composition:

- **CSA**: can be carried by a single 'legal entity'
- **RIA and IA**: at least 3 'legal entities' established in at least 3 different Member States and/or Associated Countries . The entities must be independent from each other

Additional eligibility criterion for specific 6 RIA topics

Any other eligibility conditions set out in the call or topic page



Scores

0 Proposal does not meet the criterion at all or cannot be assessed due to missing or incomplete information

1 Poor – serious weaknesses

2 Fair – goes some way to meeting criterion, but with significant weaknesses

3 Good – but with a number of shortcomings

4 Very good – but with a small number of shortcomings

5 Excellent – meets criterion in every relevant respect. Any shortcomings are minor

Four thresholds

- Excellence score = min. 3/5
- Implementation score = min. 3/5
- Impact score = min. 4/5
- The sum of the three individual scores = min. 11/15

For Innovation Actions, to determine the ranking, the score for the criterion 'impact' will be given a weighting of 1.5

- Online grant preparation: The process is supported through the Participant Portal.
- Follow your proposal: The grant agreement and its annexes must not differ from the proposal. No negotiation in H2020.
- **Timeframe:** 5 months after the call deadline to inform successful applicants; +3 months to sign the Grant Agreement. 8 months total
